C **"God is not human, that he should lie, not a human being, that he should change his mind. Does he speak and then not act? Does he promise and not fulfill? (Numbers 23:19).**
- M These same words, however, are an indictment of the sinful human nature. We do lie. We say we will do one thing, but then do another. We fail to keep our promises. Sin infects us to the core. What we deserve from God is eternal wrath and punishment. Instead, God offers grace and forgiveness in Christ. Let us, therefore, turn to God, humble ourselves before him, and confess our sin, seeking his assurance of mercy and grace.

Cup your hands to receive the wafer. Pause as the pastor says, "Take and eat. The body of the Lord." Move to the communion table and pick up a cup. The assistant will say, "Take and drink. The blood of the Lord." Then dispose of the cup and return to your seat by one of the side aisles.


ST. PAUL'S CHILD CARE CENTER IS HIRING

RAINBOWS CHILDREN'S GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP







Jonah – A Lesson in God’s Inconsistency

1. Have fun getting to know each other:
 - a. What were some of the inconsistencies that you saw in your parents when you were a child about which you laugh with them now?
 - b. What are some of your inconsistencies that frustrate people around you?
2. Read Matthew 21:28-32 and Jonah 1:1-3. Compare Jonah to the two sons of the parable. Which of the two sons is he like?
3. Read Jonah 3:1-10. What had the LORD threatened? What happened? Was the LORD being inconsistent, saying one thing but doing another?
4. Read Jonah 4:1-4. Why do you think that “inconsistency” in God frustrated Jonah? Have you ever felt that way?
5. God only appears inconsistent as he proclaims law and gospel. The inconsistency lies in each of us because we have a sinful nature that often leads us to say one thing and do another. Read this week’s Old Testament lesson Ezekiel 18:30-32. What is the LORD’s constant desire?
6. Close by reading together Ephesians 3:14-21 as your prayer for each other, that every person in your group might grasp the constant of the Savior’s forgiving love.

- **Confess your inconsistency:** 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 describes consistent love. Our inconsistent love toward people reveals our inconsistent love toward our Father.
- **Plan for consistency:** What is your personal plan to return to the Father’s presence? What is your daily plan to repent and hear God’s forgiveness? What is your weekly plan?
