THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 5:1-7

Isaiah records a vineyard parable to underscore the incredible patience God displayed toward his Old Testament people.

I will sing for the one I love

a song about his vineyard:

My loved one had a vineyard

on a fertile hillside.

²He dug it up and cleared it of stones

and planted it with the choicest vines.

He built a watchtower in it

and cut out a winepress as well.

Then he looked for a crop of good grapes,

but it yielded only bad fruit.

³ "Now you dwellers in Jerusalem and people of Judah,

judge between me and my vineyard.

⁴What more could have been done for my vineyard

than I have done for it?

When I looked for good grapes,

why did it yield only bad?

⁵Now I will tell you

what I am going to do to my vineyard:

I will take away its hedge,

and it will be destroyed;

I will break down its wall,

and it will be trampled.

⁶I will make it a wasteland,

neither pruned nor cultivated,

and briers and thorns will grow there. I will command the clouds not to rain on it." ⁷The vineyard of the LORD Almighty is the nation of Israel, and the people of Judah are the vines he delighted in. And he looked for justice, but saw bloodshed; for righteousness, but heard cries of distress.

PSALM OF THE DAY

Psalm 118

The psalmist sings of his confidence in the goodness of the Lord. Jesus will quote a portion of this psalm in today's Gospel.

- M The LORD is my strength and my song; he has become my salvation.
- C The LORD'S right hand is lifted high; the LORD'S right hand has done mighty things!
- M I will not die but live, and will proclaim what the LORD has done.
- C I will give you thanks, for you answered me; you have become my salvation.
- M The stone the builders rejected has become the capstone;
- C the LORD has done this, and it is marvelous in our eyes.
- M This is the day the LORD has made;
- C let us rejoice and be glad in it.

SECOND LESSON

Philippians 3:12-21

The Apostle Paul urges us to follow his example by keeping our eyes on the heavenly prize.

¹²Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. ¹³Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, ¹⁴I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.

¹⁵ All of us, then, who are mature should take such a view of things. And if on some point you think differently, that too God will make clear to you. ¹⁶Only let us live up to what we have already attained.

¹⁷ Join together in following my example, brothers and sisters, and just as you have us as a model, keep your eyes on those who live as we do. ¹⁸ For, as I have often told you before and now tell you again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ. ¹⁹ Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is set on earthly things. ²⁰ But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body. I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

- Confessing our sins before God, he invites us to find r_____ in Jesus (1 John 1:7).
- Jesus is the c_____ of God's Church, and he provides purpose and direction in our lives.
- Jesus is the One by whom all people with either s _____ or f _____ on the Day of Judgment (Luke 2:34, 35).
- We shake our heads in amazement at the p_____ love of our heavenly Father.

Conclusion: God permissive? No. God patient, persistent, persevering? Yes.
