REFORMATION 500

LUTHERANS STAND ON SCRIPTURE ALONE

During the Middle Ages, the church had developed a “three-legged stool” upon which to base doctrine:

- The Bible,
- Tradition (church councils and teachers of the past), and
- The teaching authority of the church (the teachings of current bishops and the pope).

After studying the Bible and church history for a decade, Dr. Martin Luther was forced to take a stand. Was this three-legged stool a firm foundation for his faith?



On April 18, 1521, Dr. Martin Luther stood before the assembly of German princes called the Diet in the city of Worms, Germany. He was commanded by Charles V, the Emperor who ruled much of Europe, to recant what he had written. Luther responded: “Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason—for I do not trust either in the pope or councils alone, since it is well known that they have often erred and contradicted themselves—I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and will not retract anything since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience” (*Luther’s Works*, Volume 32, page 112).

Today, Christians are still challenged to base their faith on a three-legged stool of sources:

- The Bible,
- Science, and
- Society’s opinions.

But what do we do when those sources contradict each other? Will we have the strength of conviction to say with Luther, “Here I stand” on Scripture alone?

That is our next Reformation 500 challenge and prayer.

Scripture Alone

2 Kings 22:1-11; 23:1-3

Luther lived in a time when the grip of human tradition on the church (along with all its errors) was so tight it seemed nothing could turn the tide. Risking his life in the process, Luther held tight to the Word and its truth, and the power of the Word literally changed the world.

November 5

Christ Alone

Acts 4:1-12

We are naturally prone to put our hope and faith in the things and the people of this world. Yet there is only One who can help and save us from any and every calamity of body and soul.

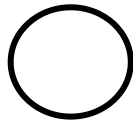

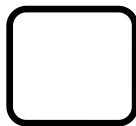

Reformation 500 **Here I Stand! Faith Alone!** **John 5:24-29, page 1068**

1. Righteousness by Do, Try, or Be... Which is it?

- a. Do: "Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48).
- b. Try: "Do what is within you!" (Pre-Reformation Theology)
- c. Be: "In the gospel, the righteousness of God is revealed... 'The righteous will live by faith'" (Romans 1:17).

2. Righteousness by Faith Alone Changes Everything.
