## **A Generous People**

St. Paul's is a generous family of faith. Sometimes we don't even realize how God has used us to make a difference for eternity in the lives of so many people. Did you know that...

St. Paul's is a leader in our synod. In 2016, we gave \$279,000 as we partnered with the other congregations in our synod to support mission work in 24 nations and in 160 mission fields in our own country, as well as training the payt constant.

country, as well as training the next generation of pastors and teachers at our synod's four worker-training schools.

 St. Paul's is a leader of the Wisconsin Lutheran High School Conference, providing \$135,000 in support. Through your generosity, these 10 young people were baptized in January 2017 at a chapel service. Every week, your generosity allows 733 young people to gain a Christian worldview at the feet of Christian instructors.



- St. Paul's provides an average of \$3,700 in offering subsidy for every student in our K-8<sup>th</sup> grade Elementary School. Through your generosity, we can tell any parent interested in Christian education, "Don't let the cost hold you back from considering this option."
- Tuition is also part of our generosity. We don't view tuition as a "payment for services" business transaction. Rather tuition received is part of the generous and willing response of God's people here at St. Paul's to support gospel ministry that benefits your children and others.

## **PUERTO RICO MISSION PROJECT**



Miguel's house is on the left. The car farthest to right cannot make it to Miguel's house because the bridge was destroyed by the hurricane. Also noteworthy are the trees which are missing their leaves – also stripped by Maria. On September 20, 2017, Hurricane Maria slammed into Puerto Rico, dumping two feet of rain and bringing winds of 150 miles per hour and incredible devastation. St. Paul's member Diane Ludwig (nee Colon-Rodriguez) is related to many people in Barranquitas (population 31,000) in the center of the island.

## **Immediate Help**

Last week, we reported that Diane Ludwig's brother-in-law, Miguel, received all 28 of the packages Diane and her sister, Iris, had sent in October. Since then, nine additional packages of food and medical supplies have been shipped to our new friends in Barrancas Sector Matadero funded by gifts already received from St. Paul's members. Those packages were slated to be delivered on November 16. The intermediate plan to send one additional package each day between now and the end of November is being implemented.

#### **Future Help**

Plans are also being formulated to send two Spanish-speaking St. Paul's representatives to Barranquitas in late November/early December. This initial trip would be to

personally assess the current situation in Barrancas Sector Matadero and identify physical and spiritual ways in which St. Paul's might best be able to help. Our intent is to supply these St. Paul's representatives with Walmart and Costco gift cards, in amounts up to \$1,000, that they and Miguel together could use during their visit to meet immediate needs.

The trip would also allow our visitors to take a look at neighboring neighborhoods to evaluate what is happening there.

Additional mission trips may be scheduled periodically in the months ahead to minister to the physical and spiritual needs of the Puerto Rican people in Barrancas and the broader Barranquitas community as God wills. Keep these people and our team in your prayers as we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving.

This program further develops their English-speaking skills by engaging in conversation through Bible stories.
