

Midweek Advent Evening Prayer Service Carols for the Newborn King December 6, 2017



LET MY PRAYER RISE BEFORE YOU




- M Let our prayers be acceptable in your sight. Come and help us in time of need that we may sing your praise in holy joy now and forever, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.



LORD'S PRAYER


C Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven.


