BELLS AND WELCOME

GIFT OPENING: For you with perfect love from God

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

- God has and always will love his people perfectly, sending them what they need at just the right time. Today we hear Isaiah's message declare words of encouragement and hope to a people on the verge of despair. Isaiah confidently sings, "I will praise you, O LORD, your anger has turned away and you have comforted me. Surely God is my salvation...my strength...my song. I will trust in him and not be afraid" (Isaiah 12). What a song of hope!
- We light the fourth Advent candle, the candle of hope. May the hope we have in Christ Jesus, our Savior, burn brightly in our hearts. Christ's death and resurrection secures our salvation. No matter how difficult things may be, Jesus' love and salvation is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Heaven is our home. We, too, can sing a song of hope!

The fourth Advent candle is lit as the congregation sings.

My hosannas and my palms Graciously receive, I pray you. Evermore, as best I can. Savior, I will homage pay you, And in faith I will embrace, Lord, your merit through your grace. (v. 3)

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M Dear friends, let us approach God with a true heart and confess our sins. O Lord, you have faithfully stood by us and watched our wandering ways. We rely on ourselves and others for direction. We search in all the wrong places until we are ready to give up...as if we were a people without hope. Yet, you stand before us with your arms wide open and your heart full of immeasurable love and forgiveness. We humbly come before you today in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to ask for your forgiveness and mercy.
- O faithful Lord of perfect love, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin. For faithless worrying and selfish pride, for sins of habit and sins of choice, for the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do, you should cast me away from your presence forever. O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.
- M Hear the words of sure hope our God has for each and every one of us. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. As a called servant of God I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- M In the peace of forgiveness won for us by our Advent King, let us praise the Lord.

Hail, hosanna, David's Son! Help, Lord; hear our supplication! Let your kingdom, scepter, crown Bring us blessing and salvation That forever we may sing Hail, hosanna! to our King. (v. 4)

Once again we gather around your Word. Send your Holy Spirit to strengthen our faith and cheer our spirit. As we hear Isaiah and Mary respond to your words of salvation with hope-filled songs, touch our hearts with the same humble gratitude and joyful praise. May we learn to sing a new song of hope that will ring out to a world that so desperately needs to hear your words of love and peace. We pray in the name of Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

- 5. Isaiah 12:3 encourages us that "With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation." What are some wells of salvation God has placed in our world today to encourage us?
- 6. Pastor Bonack encouraged us to take a cue from the Who's of Whoville and sing more songs of God's bling.
 - What does that look like in your life this week?
 - What could you do to make this song spill over onto the pre-Christians in your life, maybe causing them to sing a little, too?
- 7. Wrap up your meeting this week by reading Luke 2:1-20 together and if your group is musically inclined sing a well-loved Christmas song together, too.
