WHAT TIME IS IT? TIME TO REFORM

November 3, 4, and 7, 2018

500 years ago, Martin Luther was wrestling with how we understand who God is. Most people build their picture of God on what they expect him to be like. The result is that we make a God in our image. Luther believed it was time to get a true picture of God and the only way to do that was to look at God's own revelation of himself in Christ hanging on the cross. Is it time for the church, time for us, to reform the way we approach our understanding of God?

- M Upon this, your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
 - Stand up, stand up for Jesus, stand in his strength alone; The arm of flesh will fail you, you dare not trust your own. Put on the gospel armor; each piece put on with prayer. Where duty calls or danger, be never wanting there.
- M Fight the good fight of faith!
- C For the Lord, the righteous Judge, has laid up for us a crown of life,
- M for us, and for all who await his appearing.
- C Stand up, stand up for Jesus, the strife will not be long; This day the din of battle, the next the victor's song.
