



My Next Steps so that I Shine!

- **Prepare for the spiritual warfare.** This week, read or listen to the 12 chapter book of Daniel several times. Let the victories of God's people give you hope for the spiritual battles you face.
- **Pray for eternal glory.** Pray that God would use you to bring the people in your area of influence (family, work, school, neighborhood) closer to Christ.
- Celebrate your victory. Post this memory verse on your refrigerator as part of your Thanksgiving celebration: "At that time your people—everyone whose name is found written in the book—will be delivered" (Daniel 12:1). Let your family know that you want them to be part of "your people."
