## **SING TO THE LORD: A STUDY OF LUTHERAN HYMNODY**




## GroupWork

Bible Study Discussion Starters

*Life application materials for us in Connector Groups, home devotions, and other small groups.*

1. How has your last week of preparation for Jesus' birthday been? Do you feel ready to celebrate or are you feeling more ready to take a nap?
2. This week's message gives us reason to pause and reflect on one more way that Jesus is the answer to the hopes and fears of all the years. What has been your biggest take-away that you've gained from this Advent series?
3. Read the sermon text (Matthew 1:18-25) together.
  - How might these verses have sounded differently if Jesus had been born in today's culture?
  - What would have remained the same regardless of cultural differences?
4. One of the big themes of this message was the idea of surprise. The way our Savior came to us was certainly not how he was expected to arrive.
  - When was the last time God "surprised" you?
  - Was your reaction more like Mary or Joseph? How so?
5. Read Genesis 18:1-15. Compare and contrast Abraham and Sarah's reaction to Joseph and Mary's. In what ways did each couple honor God?
6. Have you or someone you love lost the awe and wonder of this amazing gift of salvation? Close your time together in prayer that we all marvel at his gift not just at Christmas time but in every season.

- **Memorize** Matthew 1:23 – “The virgin will conceive and give birth to a Son, and they will call him Immanuel (which means, ‘God with us’).”
- **Marvel** that God would go to such great lengths to save you from your sin.
- **Pray** for the Holy Spirit to fill you with the courage and confidence you need to witness to the truth of Immanuel, God with us.
