





CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Second Article of the Apostles' Creed with Luther's Explanation

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord.

He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death. All this he did that I should be his own, and live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness, just as he has risen from death and lives and rules eternally. This is most certainly true.

- C May the Lord our God be with us as he was with our fathers; may he never leave us nor forsake us.
- M May this be a time, O Lord, for confession and repentance. Forgive us for the apathy that harms our faith and hinders our works. Forgive us for boasting of our past achievements and for blaming others for our present problems. Rid us of indifference to public worship and Bible study. Destroy the distrust that plagues us, and shatter every thought and word that harms the unity of the Spirit and the bond of peace.
- C Create in us pure hearts, O God, and renew steadfast spirits within us.
- M Let this be a time, O Lord, when we recommit and reconsecrate ourselves to the ministry of the gospel. Help us to fulfill our *10 for 10 Plans for Giving* that we have placed upon your altar. Use our offerings to proclaim your glorious grace here and around the world. Let us find joy in our unity, zeal for our work, and success in our labor.
