


CONFESSION OF SINS



CONFESSION OF FAITH The Nicene Creed





OUR COMMUNION PRACTICE

The Lord's Supper is a fellowship meal. In this meal Jesus expresses his fellowship with us by giving us his body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. In this meal we also express our fellowship with each other, that is, that we are united in a common confession of faith.

We at St. Paul's want everyone to enjoy this fellowship meal. However, we cannot ask someone to express agreement with us until we give that person an opportunity to discover what we teach. That is why we schedule frequent membership classes to provide an overview of our teachings. Please ask one of our pastors for the date when the next class begins.

If you are a member of St. Paul's or a member of a WELS or ELS congregation, we invite you to express our common confession by communing with us. You may wish to use the "Personal Preparation for Holy Communion" on page 156 of Christian Worship to examine yourself. Please register your intent to commune as a member or guest by filling out the Connection Card and placing it in the offering plate.

The light-colored cups in the center of the individual cup tray contain non-alcoholic wine. Glutenfree wafers are located in the trays on the Communion rail. The first pews in the left center section are reserved for those who have difficulty approaching the Communion rail.



 - d. In your own life? (Share only if you feel comfortable doing so.)
- 3. Read Colossians 1:15-20. Which phrases are the most remarkable descriptions of Jesus in your mind?
- 4. Read Revelation 1:9-18 where Jesus as King reveals himself to the Apostle John and the Church living in a time of great spiritual darkness. What in this vision of Jesus comforts you the most?
- 5. Read Exodus 40:34-38. When Moses dedicated the Tabernacle at Mt. Sinai, the cloud of the Glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle. Then Moses explained that the same cloud remained visible as they traveled through the wilderness. That visible presence of God would comfort and reassure God's people.
 - Discuss this statement: Personal worship and worship as a congregation are meant to help us "see" God's glory so we receive the same comfort as the Israelites did.
- 6. Review as a group the windows in our sanctuary which follow the church year. How does each season of the church year help you see that the Kingdom of God's Son is greater than the dominion of darkness that we see in the world around us?
- 7. Close with prayer and the Lord's Prayer.
