CONFESSION OF SINS

- M Brothers and sisters in Christ, for centuries the faithful Old Testament believers waited longingly for the promise of a Savior to be fulfilled.
- C We can imagine the faith-struggle they went through, wondering if God really was going to keep his promise.
- M Faith-struggle is a reality in our lives, too. We wonder if God really will show up, if he will keep his promises to help and rescue us. In times of weakness we find ourselves filled with doubts and misgivings. But God longs to heal us. So we bring our lack of faith, along with all our sins, and lay them at the foot of Jesus' cross.

- All O Lord, do not rebuke me in your anger or discipline me in your wrath. My guilt has overwhelmed me like a burden too heavy to bear. I am bowed down and brought very low; I groan in anguish of heart. I confess my iniquity; I am troubled by my sin. O Lord, do not forsake me; be not far from me. Come quickly to help me, O Lord, my Savior (*Psalm* 38:1,4,6).
- M Because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. In Jesus you have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace (*Ephesians 2:4-5 and 1:7*).
- C We have been brought from death to life. Sin shall not be our master, because we are not under law, but under grace (*Romans 6:13-14*).

- M We pray though Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.





- 5. God certainly fulfills promises, but what about expectations? What evidence do you see in scripture from long ago and in our world today that mankind often confuses those two things?
- 6. Break into small groups of 2-3 and share what expectations you might have this season that are joy-robbers. Pray for each other that Jesus can instead be your joy-bringer!
