




# THE END AND THE BEGINNING OF 10 FOR 10

In October we began the 10 for 10 emphasis. We studied three Biblical principles:

- First fruits giving rather than giving God our second-best. The prophet Haggai challenged us to ask: Am I like the Israelites of 520 BC? Am I choosing to look out for myself first, and then giving God something if I have any left?
- Proportionate giving rather than lazy giving. In the parable of the Ten Talents, Jesus' words convicted us: "You wicked, lazy servant." How have we taken the easy way out in our giving decisions? But his words to the two faithful



- servants encouraged us. Each was gifted differently, and each responded proportionately. "Well done, good and faithful servant... Come and share your master's happiness." We were encouraged to test God with the promise about the tithe (giving 10% on income) in Malachi 1.
- **Sacrificial giving** rather than safe giving. We were inspired by the faith of the poor widow who gave all she had to worship her Savior.

Many of us then submitted **10 for 10 Plans for Giving** which have been on the altar for the last 10 weeks. If we had not previously tithed, we were encouraged to test God with the tithe for ten weeks – our 10 for 10.

In January, our 10 for 10 Plans for Giving will be mailed back to us unopened so that each of us can evaluate our offerings, considering if they are **first fruit offerings**, **proportionate gifts**, **or given sacrificially**.

#### Sacrificial Giving: Our Final 10 for 10 Video

Today during our offering, Kella Kunz introduces us to St. Paul's member Ken Krause, the head football coach of the two-time state champion Muskego Warriors. He talks about the sacrifices necessary to become champions and how to encourage each other when we get tired of the sacrifices.

He compares team meetings to regular worship, reminiscent of Hebrews 10: "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

May the end of our 10 for 10 Giving effort be just the beginning. May 2020 be another year of encouraging each other to live and give sacrificially!


#### **SHOP CLASS LEADERS WANTED**

Pastor Greg Finke writes: "If I go for Jesus, I am doing the work and seeking the results of what I can accomplish. When I go with Jesus, he is doing the work and I am seeing the results of what Jesus can accomplish through me. One is hard, the other is fun. One is exhausting, the other is energizing. One causes me to worry ("Did I do everything correctly?"), the other causes me to be at peace ("Let's see what Jesus does next."). One tempts me to force things with people, the other invites me to keep loving people" (p. 30).

Refer to **Hebrews 2:17** as a "key" to the event.
- **3. Sunday's "Sermon Notes"** challenged each listener with a look at **Matthew 8:23-27**. - 4. **Read Luke 13:1-9.** The NIV editors selected the section heading of **Repent or Perish**. **God's Justice and His Patience** would also be a fitting heading. Either way, what is the primary message for all of us when bad things happen in this world?
- 5. Close with a prayer of <u>thanksgiving</u> for all God's blessings, for <u>trust</u> in God's work in the details of our lives, and for <u>strength</u> to hang on when the going is tough.
