GARDEN HOMES LUTHERAN SCHOOL SAYS THANKS!

The struggles of reading proficiency in the city of Milwaukee are well documented. For this reason, Garden Homes continues to take steps to help students be prepared and proficient in reading. First, we moved the library from the basement to the second floor of our building so the proximity of it was much closer to our students. We incorporated an up-to-date and resource rich English Language Arts (ELA) series, titled Reading Wonders, from Kindergarten through 8th grade. Accelerated Reader has been adopted to assist with independent reading. Informed choices about ELA instruction are made by analyzing both MAP testing and recent state standardized test results. This past year we added a 5th and 6th grade teaching position that focuses only on teaching ELA. Your gift to help expand the library book choices to our children falls right in line with giving our

students more options and opportunities to dig into reading and improve upon these skills.

The generous donation of \$4,257 to support our efforts in expanding our library is a tremendous blessing. On behalf of the faculty, staff, and families of Garden Homes, I want to express my sincere thanks for the support you provided our school ministry. God's blessings to the members of St. Paul's as you work fervently within your own mission field and continue to support others in their mission too.

LANDSCAPE DESIGN

Many of the shrubs and perennials at the entrance to the church and around the church sign are overgrown or have died. A gift of \$750 will allow us to pay for a landscape design that a volunteer has offered to implement. Gifts for plants will be sought this spring.

500[™] ANNIVERSARY REFORMATION SERVICE FUNDING

The southeast Wisconsin district of our church body would like to rent the Milwaukee Theatre, with a seating capacity of about 4000, to host a district-wide 500th Anniversary of the Reformation service in November of 2017. Congregations the size of St. Paul's have been asked to contribute \$1000 toward the cost of this event. Anything received beyond the cost of the service will go toward the offering gathered at that service. The offering designation has not yet been decided upon by the district leaders.

POWER OF THE PRAYING PARENT FATHER'S DAY GIFT

In connection with Father's Day, we are mailing postcards to the community with the offer: "All parents will receive a free gift: *The Power of a Praying Parent*." The cost of a book is \$5 each. This Wish List item will cover the cost of this gift that offers support to the parents in our congregation. If sufficient gifts are received, we could expand this gift to every school parent/Kids Club parent in the fall of 2017.

SCHOOL WINDOWS ON WISH LIST

The windows in the portion of our school built in 1957 need to be replaced. This summer we put energy efficient windows into the Centennial Kitchen. We would like to replace as many of the windows next summer as we have funding for. The windows in each classroom will cost approximately \$10,000. There are seven classrooms involved. The Centennial Gym windows will cost \$35,000.

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FUND

Through the government's Title II funds and our congregational budgeting process, we provide for the professional development of our teachers, but there are more workshops and courses that our teachers would like to attend. This fund provides our members with an opportunity to encourage continuing education through special gifts. Our goal is to provide an additional \$500 per teacher or \$7000 per year. Gifts of \$850 have been given to date. If you would like to contribute, mark your gift clearly, "Teacher Professional Development Fund."
