



The timing for this gift is excellent as Garden Homes plans future ministry under the leadership of a new shepherd, Pastor Christian Doerr, who was installed on January 20.


“C” THE CEILING

We have received \$452,928 in Cool Million Gifts so far. Our next goal is \$500,000 by Chicken Dinner, February 17, so we can approve the Summer 2019 plans. By the end of the summer, we will need \$827,195. If we reach our \$1 million goal by this time next year, we will have funds in our Capital Improvement Fund for the next projects on our list!


EDUCATION WRAPPED IN FAITH – OPEN HOUSE UPDATE
