If you are married, add \$7000 to the amounts shown (for example, in Wisconsin, a family of four is eligible if they earn \$51,955 or less). If you are a single parent, only one parent's income needs to be less than income limit for your child to qualify. Generous tuition assistance packages are also available apart from School Choice. We don't want the cost of tuition to keep your children from the wonderful Christian education at our school.

LANDSCAPE DESIGN WORK

Many of the shrubs and perennials at the entrance to the church and around the church sign are overgrown or have died. A gift of \$750 will allow us to pay for a landscape design that a volunteer has offered to implement. Gifts for plants will be sought this spring.

500[™] ANNIVERSARY REFORMATION SERVICE FUNDING

The southeast Wisconsin district of our church body would like to rent the Milwaukee Theatre, with a seating capacity of about 4000, to host a district-wide 500th Anniversary of the Reformation service in November of 2017. Congregations the size of St. Paul's have been asked to contribute \$1000 toward the cost of this event. Anything received beyond the cost of the service will go toward the offering gathered at that service. The offering designation has not yet been decided upon by the district leaders.

POWER OF THE PRAYING PARENT FATHER'S DAY GIFT

In connection with Father's Day, we are mailing postcards to the community with the offer: "All parents will receive a free gift: *The Power of a Praying Parent*." The cost of a book is \$5 each. This Wish List item will cover the cost of this gift that offers support to the parents in our congregation. SCHOOL WINDOWS ON WISH LIST

The windows in the portion of our school built in 1957 need to be replaced. This summer we put energy efficient windows into the Centennial Kitchen. We would like to replace as many of the windows next summer as we have funding for. The windows in each classroom will cost approximately \$10,000. There are seven classrooms involved. The Centennial Gym windows will cost \$35,000.

This fund provides our members with an opportunity to encourage continuing education through special gifts. Our goal is to provide an additional \$500 per teacher or \$7000 per year. Like Us In Every Way – GUILTY!

- 1. African-American jazz and pop music singer, dancer, actress, and civil rights activist, Lena Horne, once said, "It's not the load that breaks you down, it's the way you carry it."
 - Do you agree with that statement? Explain.
 - What load are you carrying now that's giving you some trouble?
 - How might members of your group provide a better way to carry it?
- 2. Read John 4:5-26. This account of Jesus and the Samaritan woman is a wonderful example of love breaking down barriers and opening doors. Of it, D. Shurenga writes:

Jesus appears on the scene with a new approach. He introduces a brand-new idea. He connects with sinners before they repent, before they change, so that they will change. He goes to those who need him even before they know they need him! He seeks out the least, the last, the lost so that, hearing his voice, they can experience new life. Rather than keeping them at arm's length, he embraces them (*Shurenga*, *D.*, *Today: The Family Altar, in Elmer, D., Cross Cultural Servanthood, 2006, pg. 39.*).

In this account, Jesus does several things that were forbidden by Jewish law at the time: Remained seated at the well even though a woman was coming. Initiated the conversation with a woman. Asked for a drink knowing he'd have to use her cup. Talked to her even though her coming to get water as an adult woman in mid-day meant she was in disrepute. Bantered back and forth on spiritual matters in order to test and teach her.

- Why was Jesus willing to do all of this with/for the Samaritan woman?
- Why would the words of verse 26 be so wonderful to her?
- How did the Samaritan woman respond (see verses 28-29)?
- Why would she feel comfortable inviting other sinful, guilty people to meet Jesus?
- How could this Bible story be used to express to someone hurting that Jesus a) feels their pain, and b) removes their guilt?
- 3. How does the season of Lent give you a better way to carry any load that's trying to break you down? Explain.
- 4. Read Hebrews 4:14-16. How do these verses make you feel? How can you put these feelings into action?
- PRAY: Heavenly Father, bless me now; At the cross of Christ I bow; Take my guilt and grief away; Hear and heal me now, I pray. Now, O Lord, this very hour, Send Thy grace and show Thy power; While I rest upon Thy Word; Come, and bless me now, O Lord. (author unknown)
