






COOL MILLION - CAN'T SIGN THE CHECK YET!



One in two people live in extreme poverty in sub-Saharan Africa. HIV has devastated the region, and in wake of this epidemic there are millions of orphans



struggling to exist on their own. The number of orphans in Africa that need the basic necessity of shoes is astounding - over 20 million. Shoes lower the risk of injury and infection and are a gift that lasts for years, not only as a reminder of God's love but also as catalyst to a better quality of life.
