AS WE GATHER

On this weekend Christians throughout the world join their voices in praise and proclamation of the central fact of their faith—that Jesus suffered on the cross, died, was buried, and rose on the third day. The first lesson from Acts records the earliest sermons of the church testifying to the resurrection of our Lord. The Gospel according to St. Matthew records the reaction of the women to the empty tomb. From Colossians we hear St. Paul urge us to focus on the things of the faith as we live here on earth.

FIRST LESSON

Acts 10:34-43

34 Then Peter began to speak: "I now realize how true it is that God does not show favoritism 35 but accepts men from every nation who fear him and do what is right. 36 You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, telling the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. 37 You know what has happened throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached — 38 how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him.

39 "We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a tree, 40 but God raised him from the dead on the third day and caused him to be seen. 41 He was not seen by all the people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen—by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. 42 He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. 43 All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name." 1 After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb. 2 There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. 3 His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. 4 The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men.

5 The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. 6 He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. 7 Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you." 8 So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. 9 Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. 10 Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

11 While the women were on their way, some of the guards went into the city and reported to the chief priests everything that had happened. 12 When the chief priests had met with the elders and devised a plan, they gave the soldiers a large sum of money, 13 telling them, "You are to say, 'His disciples came during the night and stole him away while we were asleep.' 14 If this report gets to the governor, we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble." 15 So the soldiers took the money and did as they were instructed. And this story has been widely circulated among the Jews to this very day.

16 Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. 17 When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. 18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."

Empty – So We Can Be Full

This is the first Group Work for our new sermon series, Empty. How is it that life, though full of options and opportunities, leaves so many people feeling empty? It has something to do with our values and everything to do with the empty tomb of Easter.

- I. It is an accepted axiom: "Voids get filled."
 - Put this axiom into your own words.
 - What practical examples could you give to prove this axiom true?
 - What voids are you currently dealing with?
 - How could your small group help you?
- 2. The definition for *void* is, "a completely empty space." Read Matthew 28:1-10.
 - What completely empty space is described in these verses?
 - Why would the angel say to the women, "Come and see?"
 - Why did the angel also say, "Go and tell."
 - How did the news of the first Easter's empty tomb fill a void in the hearts of the first followers of Jesus?
- 3. Read Colossians 3:1-4.
 - What will happen to you (it's actually already accomplished) because of Christ's empty tomb?
 - How does the empty tomb change your values?
 - Though believers in the resurrection, why is it still hard to "Set [our] minds on things above"?
 - What things do you/should you personally do to keep your head up?
- 4. The *Empty* sermon series will reflect on many of St. Paul's seven core values: 1) mission outreach, 2) diversity in worship languages, 3) authentic care, 4) connecting people inside of community, 5) marriage and family, 6) generous, meaningful living, 7) ministry excellence.
 - How do these values flow out of the empty tomb?
 - Do these values address the emptiness in peoples' lives today? Explain.
 - How do you see yourself plugging into St. Paul's core values?
