God's people have responded in an extraordinary way! We knew we wanted to add a fourth pastor position on staff to help connect our many guests to God's Word. Two weeks ago, it became evident that we would not be able to include this resident missionary position in the budget for the next year. So we asked for special gifts and commitments to match the \$40,000 grant that we received from the Antioch Foundation. We have already received gifts of \$30,000 and commitments for another \$18,750 for a total of \$48,750! This will allow us to proceed with the calling of this position very soon! All gifts received beyond the initial matching gift will provide outside-of-budget funding for this position beyond the initial 12 months. ANNUAL VOTERS' MEETING
