AS WE GATHER

Today we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, the proof for us and all the world that "Death Cannot Stop True Love." On this weekend Christians throughout the world join their voices in praise and proclamation of the most central fact of their faith—that Jesus suffered on the cross, died, was buried, and rose on the third day. In the first lesson from Isaiah, the prophet of God records in advance what we have seen by faith – salvation in Jesus! From 1 Corinthians we draw the message for today under the theme, "Do You See It? The Victory is Ours!" The Gospel according to St. John records the events on the day in history that have declared everything to be "new" in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

EASTER DIALOGUE

Excerpts from Revelation

- M Grace and peace to you from him who is, who was, and who is to come, from our Lord, Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth.
- C To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood, and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father--to him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen!
- M Then I heard a loud voice in heaven say:
- C Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God, and the authority of his Messiah.

FIRST LESSON

1 In that day you will say: "I will praise you, Lord. Although you were angry with me, your anger has turned away and you have comforted me. 2 Surely God is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid. The Lord, the Lord himself, is my strength and my defense; he has become my salvation." 3 With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.

4 In that day you will say: "Give praise to the Lord, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done, and proclaim that his name is exalted. 5 Sing to the Lord, for he has done glorious things; let this be known to all the world. 6 Shout aloud and sing for joy, people of Zion, for great is the Holy One of Israel among you."

GOSPEL

John 20:1-18

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. 2 So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

Isaiah 12:1-6

3 So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. 4 Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. 5 He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. 6 Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, 7 as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen. 8 Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. 9 (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.) 10 Then the disciples went back to where they were staying.


11 Now Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb 12 and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot. 13 They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" "They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." 14 At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. 15 He asked her, "Woman, why are looking for?"

Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him." 16 Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher"). 17 Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.""

18 Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that he had said these things to her.

Normally a man's death is the end of the story, but Jesus' burial at the close of Good Friday was just the end of Act I of his life. The time in the tomb was just an intermission.

On Easter the intermission ended and Act 2 began! Jesus' resurrection brings hope, forgiveness and the promise of a changed life.

If you are living in a "Good Friday" world, thinking your story is over, that your life will never change, and that you will never be good enough for God, be a part of the story!

Join us as we celebrate Act 2 of our lives because Jesus is alive!

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of lesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade" (1 Peter 1:3-4).

Transformed Acts 1:1 – 11 April 7, 8, 11 The ascended lesus is sending every member of his Church on a mission to transform lives through the message of his forgiving love.

Acts 2:1 – 47 April 14, 15, 18 Emboldened Peter's Act I was marked by a cowardly denial of Christ, but his Act II was filled with a courageous sermon that launched the church into the first century. Could you experience that same Act 2 change?

Steadfast Act 7:1 – 8:8 April 21, 22, 25 God is at work in our suffering. This was the case in the early church. We trust it is true in our lives as well.

April 28, 29, May 2 Qualified "Christian-killer" doesn't seem impressive on an apostle's resume. Yet that is who lesus chose to grow his Church. In the same way, you might consider yourself unqualified for the mission of Jesus' Church, but God loves to be glorified through unexpected servants.

Confirmation Sunday The church is always threatened by divisions—race, income, gender, age, etc. God opened Peter's mind to the bigness of God's Church. Could God bring rich and poor, male and female, black and white, young and old into one community of faith today?


