

A TITHE FOR MISSION PARTNERS

Our goal as part of a Cool Million is to tithe (give 10%) of our gifts to our mission partners.

Our former teacher, Dan Thiel, is serving at Costa Maya Ministries on the Yucatan Peninsula this year. He is coming home in May for a visit. We will try to schedule a time for those interested in traveling to this mission field to meet with him during this time. A Cool Million would help subsidize a new building for worship and ministry to the Costa Mayans.

A special gift to our Malawi Mission field will honor the many years Pastor John Holtz, a son of our congregation, has served as a missionary there.

Our sister congregation, Garden Homes Lutheran, is calling a new pastor and principal. A special gift from our congregation would give the new called workers the financial resources to consider new ministry initiatives.

Friends of China sends teachers of English to China. They work for and are paid by a Chinese school. Through the relationships built with the Chinese students, the teachers share their faith in Christ. A Cool Million would send 6 people to China for a year, paying for their transportation costs, insurance, and other incidentals.


St. Paul's Loves Kids and Teens

SUMMER CARE FOR AGES 3-10 AT ST. PAUL'S


