READING

The Ascension of Our Lord

A harmony based on the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke and the Acts of the Apostles

In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God.

Soon after the resurrection, the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

On one occasion, Jesus said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.

On another occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

When Jesus had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. And he sat at the right hand of God.

They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? READING 2

Calling Us to Join His Mission; Matthew 28:16-20

READING 4

Acts 1:4-5 Sharing His Saving Power

⁴On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

Christ, seated on the throne, gracious power possessing. Comes to his people in baptismal blessing. Feeds us the Bread of Life, thus his love confessing, We are his witnesses. 6 Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

REOPENING PLANS

Dear sister/brother in Christ,

Family members love and care for each other. "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2).

The weekend of May 17, we saw that love in action as members of the St. Paul's family gathered for the first time to receive communion in groups of 10.

- Old friends talked while waiting for the Lord's Supper.
- New acquaintances were made.
- We respected social distancing and were careful to touch as little possible to keep the facility clean and safe for the next group.

The Next Steps in Love

As we begin the next steps of reopening St. Paul's, we want to consider how to show love to different groups of people.

- Love for those in "at risk" groups and those who do not wish to gather in large groups.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ We will continue our online worship of both the Traditional and Bridge services.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ We will continue to offer communion in groups of 10 for as long as needed.
 - If the need becomes evident, we will begin an "at risk" service with very limited attendance and face mask requirements.
- Love for those who desire in-person worship as soon as possible.
 - We will begin in-person worship of the Traditional Worship the weekend of May 31st, limiting attendance to 25% of capacity. The services will be Saturday @ 5 pm; Sunday @ 7:45, 9:15 and 10:45 am; Wednesday @ 7 pm. Note that we will not be offering the contemporary service at this time of transition. Registration may be required to keep our services at 25% capacity. More information will be emailed next week.
 - We will begin in-person worship of The Bridge on June 7th @ 10:15 am, limiting attendance to 25% of capacity. Registration may be required.
 - Additional services will be added the following weeks as necessary to serve all who want to worship in-person.
 - We will begin to celebrate the Lord's Supper during the in-person worship late in June.

- Love for our staff and our congregation's reputation. Interaction with a large number of people on a weekly basis dramatically increases the risk for our staff members. Christian churches have had their reputations marred because a cluster of COVID-19 cases could be traced back to a church setting. Therefore, not only for your own health, but the health of your staff and everyone present we ask the following:
- Maintain social distance. Do not sit in areas closed for social distancing purposes.
- Refrain from hugs or handshakes.
- Wear a mask as much as possible.
- Touch as little as possible to minimize risk for the next groups.
- Wash your hands often and regularly, especially after returning home.
- Stay at home if you are sick.

Other Uses of Our Facilities

- Our Child Care Center and our Summer Care program reopen on Tuesday, May 26th.
- Congregational groups can begin to use our buildings. Please inform Tammy in our church office (tmiller@stpaulmuskego.org) that your group is resuming scheduled activities so that we can ensure staff is available for cleaning. We ask that all groups respect social distancing guidelines and wear masks as much as possible.
- We will reopen our buildings for rental to non-member groups later in the summer.
