Acts 2:1-21

The Holy Spirit comes on Pentecost.

The Holy Spirit Comes at Pentecost

² When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues^[a] as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia,^[b] ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

¹³ Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

Peter Addresses the Crowd

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

¹⁷ "In the last days, God says,
I will pour out my Spirit on all people.
Your sons and daughters will prophesy,
your young men will see visions,

your old men will dream dreams.

¹⁸ Even on my servants, both men and women,
I will pour out my Spirit in those days,
and they will prophesy.

¹⁹ I will show wonders in the heavens above
and signs on the earth below,
blood and fire and billows of smoke.

²⁰ The sun will be turned to darkness
and the moon to blood
before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

²¹ And everyone who calls
on the name of the Lord will be saved.^[c]

FOLLOWING THE PROMISE – BIBLE BASICS AND YOU





Celebrate the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit

1. The disciples spent the days before Pentecost waiting for the Holy Spirit. We too are waiting to see the long-term effects of the two-month absence of public worship on God's Church.
 - a. What do you think the disciples were afraid of as they waited?
 - b. What concerns do you or others have for God's Church as we wait to see the effects of the shut-down over the next year or more?
 - c. As the disciples were waiting, "they all joined together constantly in prayer" (Acts 1:14). Begin your meeting by bringing the concerns about the Church to our God in prayer.

2. Read Acts 2:1-42. Below are some phrases that your group may want to discuss or choose your own.
 - a. "In the last days..." (v. 17) Since the Holy Spirit has been poured out, we are in "the last days." What do you think that phrase meant to the apostles? What does it mean to you?
 - b. "I will pour out my Spirit"... "You will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (vv. 17 & 38). In our baptisms we receive the promise that the Holy Spirit is poured out on us. How does this promise of the Holy Spirit comfort you?
 - c. "God's set purpose and foreknowledge..." (v. 23) The apostles didn't understand Jesus' death when it was happening. Only in hindsight did they see this was all part of God's plan. How can that comfort people as they live through the disruption and disease of the COVID-19 pandemic?
 - d. "We are all witnesses of the fact" (v. 32). Of what were the apostles to serve as witnesses? In what ways is your call to be a witness for Jesus the same and different than the call of the apostles?
 - e. "They broke bread in their homes..." (v. 42-47) What elements of that early Christian church life would you most like to bring back to our 21st century church?

3. Close with the reading of Psalm 51 as your prayer, asking the powerful Holy Spirit to come upon you and give you a new heart that claims God's forgiveness and is generous in that forgiveness toward others.

Psalm 51:7-19

Introduction: What is the threat to the Church today?

1. A crushed heart (51:7-9,17)

- a. The virus is invisible. Is it present in your heart?

“Who can discern his errors? Forgive my hidden faults” (Psalm 19:12).

- b. Wash in the blood of the Lamb.

2. A pure heart (51:10-12)

- a. With a spirit that is firmly grounded on God’s Word. I know what is right.

- b. With a spirit that is generous toward others. I want to do what is right.

3. A praising heart (51:13-15)

- a. A heart that has turned back to God.

- b. A heart that has dealt with “blood guilt.”

4. A praying heart (51:16-19)

- a. A heart concerned about “the walls of Jerusalem.”

- b. A heart that asks, “Use me.”
