
CONFESSION OF SINS



We have received 227 gifts or plans for giving resulting in \$220,159 in gifts or plans for giving, resulting in \$220,159 in gifts already received and \$624,000 in total gifts and plans. As a result of this generous response, repaving of the school playground will occur this week. We have signed the contract to replace the windows in the Centennial gym. The HVAC contractor is getting permits to begin work on a new heating/cooling

My Next Steps in Letting My Extraordinary God Use an Ordinary Person Like Me

- Learn from History: Over the next three weeks, read the Book of Judges, a chapter per day, to see that ours is a God who uses the strengths of weak Christians to accomplish his purpose. If you don't have a Bible, pick one up at the Welcome Center.
- Confess your Weaknesses: Meditate on the fact that the Holy Spirit placed Samson's sins and yours on the same level in 1 Corinthians 6:9-11.
