#### **MISSION NEWS FROM HONG KONG**

In the coming months, we will highlight world mission news from the Book of Reports and Memorials prepared for this year's synod convention.

In the last year the Commission on Inter-Church Relations (CICR) has been working with the South Asian Lutheran Evangelical Mission (SALEM) in Hong Kong on devising and clarifying their "Statement of Faith." In recent months the CICR has witnessed positive developments, which seem to indicate a maturing church body growing in their appreciation of scriptural doctrine and practice. The CICR recommends that WELS declare fellowship with SALEM and sponsor SALEM for associate membership in the Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference. (*Book of Reports and Memorials* for the 2017 Synod Convention, page 27)

St. Paul's leads our church body in support of mission work around the world! Of every dollar you give to our General Fund, 13% is sent to the synod to support our work together. Praise God that you are part of God's work in Hong Kong!

- 1. What kinds of highs and lows did you experience this week? Take a moment to thank God for his joy in the highs and for his strength in the lows.
- 2. Which statement do you identify with the most?:
  - I struggle with believing God *really* wants me to come to him with ALL my requests.
  - I struggle with believing God will *really* answer my prayers.
  - I don't struggle with believing, I struggle with doing carving out the time to *authentically* talk with God daily.
- 3. Read I Kings 3:5-10. This weekend's message was entitled "When God Gives Us a Blank Check," referring to God allowing Solomon to "ask for whatever you want me to give you." What would you ask for if God gave you this blank-check opportunity?
- 4. Why do you suppose God gave Solomon this blank-check opportunity?
- 5. Look specifically at I Kings 3:6-9. What does Solomon's answer reveal about his heart?
- 1. What practices do you (or *could* you) have in place in your life to help you to know your requests line up with God's will for your life?
- 6. The Fourth Petition of the Lord's Prayer is give us this day our daily bread. In his explanation of what this means, Luther writes: God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.
  - Why do you suppose it's so hard to remember to thank God for the blessings you receive that you didn't even have to ask for?
  - As a group, brainstorm one or two practical ways you could be reminded of to do this more on a regular basis.

Prayer Is Powerful + When God Gives a Blank Check +

I Kings 3:5-12 (Bible page 333)

Introduction: What do you need?
