

- C Open our ears today to hear how you did all that we could not do for ourselves. May your words of truth touch our hearts with believing faith.







GROWING CLOSER TO CHRIST

WHAT IS LWMS?

Women and girls of St. Paul's, this is *your* organization. Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS) is made up of mission-minded women of our church body, Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS). *Every* St. Paul's woman is a member of LWMS by default since St Paul's is a WELS congregation. All monies raised for LWMS are for home and world mission projects not covered in the synod budget.

Active LWMS members meet to hear mission speakers, worship together, and sponsor mission projects of their choosing at local circuit rallies held biannually in April and October. In addition, LWMS hosts an annual convention at a central location in the States which brings together members from across the country and around the world.

At St. Paul's, the Dorcas Society and St. Paul's Ladies Afternoon Fellowship members actively support LWMS, and home and world missionaries with their prayers, cards, and offerings. Dorcas meets every third Tuesday of the month (Sept-May) at 7:00 pm in the Grace Room and Ladies Afternoon Fellowship meets the first Wednesday of the month (Sept-May) at noon in the Faith Room.

These two ladies' groups encourage the women of St. Paul's to learn about, pray for, and support LWMS and WELS mission efforts in North America and around the world. Again, the offerings received from congregations like ours for LWMS go towards projects and items not in the synod budget.

Please consider giving an offering and/or becoming a member of one of St. Paul's ladies' groups. The Dorcas Society and LAF will be sponsoring Under the Canopy on July 22 and 23. Stop for a snack and ask questions. The ladies will be looking forward to talking with you!

MAKING YOUR BIBLE YOUR BEST FRIEND FOREVER

"The Word of God is living and active" (Hebrews 4:12). We believe that. But how many of us have started to read the Bible and got bogged down in endless lists of names and laws? Do you want help making sense of it all? Could your Bible be your BFF? In the study *Through the Bible in a Year*, you will use your own Bible as your "textbook," so you can highlight and take notes that will help you for a lifetime. Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. You will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and that you do not need to live in bondage to certain emotions. - 1. Share your highs and lows from the week with your group. Was there some type of re-occurring theme in your life over the past seven days?
- 2. What kind of stereotypes do you observe surrounding the idea of confession in our world today?
- 3. In this weekend's message, Pastor Bonack challenges us to think of confession as *fun*. What would a person have to believe for confession to truly be fun?
- 4. Read Psalm 32:3-4. David's sin [of sleeping with another man's wife] caused him to be consumed with fear, embarrassment, and shame. Can you think of a time when you felt what David felt in these verses? What helped you overcome those feelings?
- 5. Read Genesis 3:8-13. Adam and Eve's sin lead to fear, embarrassment, and shame, also. If you, knowing what you know now about God, were in the garden with him during these six verses, what would you say to help Adam and Eve break free of these toxic feelings?
- 6. Jesus' perfect life, death, and resurrection frees us from the burden of fixing our sins. Confession gives us the strength to put the fix-it business in God's hands.
 - Can you think of a time when you tried to fix it instead of giving it to God?
 - Why is "fixing it yourself" never really effective in breaking the cycle of sin, fear, embarrassment, and shame?
 - Is there anything in your life right now that you want to confess and let go of but you need prayers of strength to work up the courage to confess? (Feel free to share only details you feel comfortable sharing.)
- 7. Can you think of anyone in your life that might need to hear this message of freedom through confession? What could you do this week that might encourage them towards their forgiving Heavenly Father?

Next Steps

- The end of fear. What are you hiding? Confess it to God and find freedom!
- The end of shame. Shame says that we are fatally flawed. Its focus is on what we were instead of what we are. Arm yourself against shame by memorizing I Peter 2:9: But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.
- **The end of me.** What are you trying to fix in your life? Pray for God to help you let go of the feeling that it's all up to you. Specifically tell him that you're giving whatever it is up to him.
