

That truth is the foundation stone of the Church.



The Next Stone

But what is the next stone Jesus uses to build his church?

It is a stone that Satan is trying to pull out of God's Church. Satan can pull it out because

- we don't have time for it,
- we don't feel qualified to lead it,
- we don't feel connected to it.

The Importance of Family

The Family Stone is the next stone Jesus lays upon the foundation. The family is where faith is most often and most thoroughly passed on. God instructed family leaders, "These commandments I give you today... Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up" (Deuteronomy 6:6,7).

But today, the family is under attack.

- Our schedules declare that work has become more important than family,
- Parents haven't learned how to pass on their faith to their children,
- Families are dysfunctional and many adults don't feel there is a "family" to which they belong.

The Family Church

Beginning September 9, we want to help you put that "next stone" back into its place. We want to help moms and dads see their families as the primary church they are called to shepherd. We want to help adults become a part of spiritual families (Life Groups) so they can encourage others and be encouraged.

Included in our fall program will be:

- A message series based on Ephesians that will help you see your role in the family, whether that be the nuclear family or a family of believers in a Life Group.

- GroupLink the weekend of September 14-16 to help you get connected to a Life Group.

55TH ANNUAL LUTHERAN WOMEN'S MISSIONARY SOCIETY CONVENTION RECAP

A group of 8 women from St. Paul's and Christ in Bed Bend joined over 1500 others in attending the 55th Annual Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS) Convention in Green Bay in June. Over 800 WELS and ELS churches had members present for mission support, spiritual renewal, inspiration, and fellowship.



Missionaries and a panel of missionary wives shared their experiences of serving the Lord at home and abroad. Workshops included the topics of Hispanic outreach, campus ministry, and childcare education as an outreach tool. A presentation on the WELS new congregational short-term Mission Journeys program was also given. Convention highlights included the celebration of the 125th anniversary of the Apache Mission in Arizona and an opportunity to hear the latest home and world mission developments from WELS Boards for Home and World Administrators Pastor Keith Free and Pastor Larry Schlomer.

The 56th Annual LWMS Convention will be held at the lowa Event Center in Des Moines, June 27-30, 2019.

Possible Steps to Take Toward an Unshakable Faith

- **Be inspired to be "All In":** Google *Fox's Book of Martyrs* to read about the courage of Christians who have gone before us. Go www.icommittopray.com to pray for those who are suffering now because they have the courage to follow Jesus in spite of the cost.
- Exhale and Inhale: Take time to take an inventory of times you have compromised your faith. Confess them to God, and perhaps to a trusted Christian (exhale). Memorize the good news of Jesus' forgiveness in Psalm 130 (inhale).
- Walk with Jesus: Continue reading Luke from chapter 9 to the end and see that Jesus was "all in" to seek and to save sinners like us. Trust that he can "cloth you with power from on high" (Luke 24:49) so that you might have an "All In" faith.
