

"DOOR OF HOPE" SPECIAL OFFERING

During the month of August, our anticipated receipts through offerings and tuition for this fiscal year was reduced by \$100,000! (The Special Edition of the Messenger supplies more detail.) Three families have stepped forward to match, dollar for dollar, all special "Door of Hope" gifts up to \$50,000. If we can match that total amount, we will have completely recovered our anticipated shortfall.

Our window of opportunity is short. All "Door of Hope" gifts or commitments need to be made by Monday, September 24. The Ministry Board, meeting later that week, is committed to "living within our means" so that we do not spend more than we expect God will provide. If staffing cuts are necessary, we need to make those decisions quickly.

Remember that this needs to be an "over and above" gift. If we simply transfer regular giving to "Door of Hope," we will not be able to reach the challenging 4.5% increase in regular offerings upon which we based our ministry plan.

SUNDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY

Let's Get to Know God and Ourselves a Little Better – Begins Sunday, September 10, at 9:15 am in the Grace Room. Taught by retired Martin Luther College professor, Pastor Daniel Deutschlander.

St. Augustine said that all of theology can be found either directly or indirectly in the first three chapters of the Bible. He was right! In our study of Genesis I-3 we will come to see God's own masterful description of himself, especially as he creates all that is just for us. We will examine how he relates the way he is to our creation as he forms us from dust but, nevertheless, creates us in his own image and likeness. How, after all, can something made from dust carry God's own image and be like God? Do we still have his image? Are there ways that even now we are like God?

In God's own description of Adam and Eve we will consider in some detail how we are spiritual beings hidden inside of a physical form. That is, we will examine the "organs of the soul" and how they relate to God and to our bodies. If God made everything, did he make evil too? How different is God's definition of "freedom" from the one most people have? Is God and are the holy angels and the saints in heaven really "free" if they cannot sin? How different is God's definition of "death" from the one most people have?

We will examine carefully the fall of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden to see what difference it made in the "organs of the soul," and how those organs now use the body to accomplish the will of the soul. Most importantly we will consider what the account of their fall reveals about God and the way he is with his fallen creation from then on until the end of time.

In sum, we will get to know God and ourselves a lot better!

FALL SMALL GROUP SERIES

As always, the fall is a great time to test drive a small group and experience the profound impact it can have on your faith life. During late September and early October small groups will meet to dig deeper into the concept of worldview, coinciding with our message



series. Whether or not we realize it, we all have certain presuppositions and biases that affect the way we view all of life and reality. Many people fail to recognize the extent to which their worldview impacts their thinking. As Christians we have our own unique worldview—one that is based on the ultimate source of truth, the Word of God. The foundations of our worldview are found in the early chapters of the book of Genesis. That will be the scriptural focus of our study.  - What was Anna's response to meeting the Savior?
 - God chose to bestow this precious honor on Anna NOT in her youth or middle years, but in her golden years. What can we learn from this?
- 7. If you are not yet in your Golden Years, what could you do this week to encourage someone you love in their Golden Years that they are meaningful and relevant? If you are in your Golden Years, what could you do this week to shape and care for the younger generations?

Two Godly Reminders about Growing Old

Introduction: Meaningless! Everything is meaningless!

I. A reminder about aging

- A. The years approach when you will say, "I find no pleasure in them."
 - ... The sun and the light and the moon and the stars grow dark. sadness in growing old
 - ...The clouds return after the rain. bodies don't heal as quickly as they once did; healing and recovery time are slowed
 - ...The keepers of the house tremble, and the strong men stoop. Arms and hands and legs and feet grow week; spine curves.
 - ...The grinders cease because they are few. number of teeth declines
 - ... Those looking through the windows grow dim. eyesight weakens
 - ...The doors to the street are closed and the sound of grinding fades. hearing loss
 - ...People rise up at the sound of the birds. don't sleep well
 - ... All their songs grow faint. once strong voice fades
 - ...People are afraid of heights and of dangers in the streets. a fear of falling and going out alone
 - ... The almond tree blossoms. hair turns white or falls out
 - ... The grasshopper drags itself along. gait becomes stiff and unsteady
 - ...Desire no longer is stirred. loss of appetite for food or for passion
- B. People go to their eternal home and mourners go about the streets.
 - ...silver cord is severed
 - ...golden bowl is broken
 - ...pitcher is shattered
 - ...wheel is broken
 - ...dust (body) returns to the ground and spirit (soul) returns to God
- C. Life on earth goes on.
- D. Meaningless! Meaningless! Everything is meaningless!

2. A reminder about meaning

- A. Know and believe the gospel: God loves you and wants to have a relationship with you through his Son, Jesus Christ (1 John 3:10).
- B. Believe and live the gospel: In Christ you have a new identity (2 Corinthians 5:17-19).

Conclusion: Meaningful! Meaningful! Everything is meaningful!

My Next Steps

- Read the first three chapters of Genesis to prepare for the Soul Searching message series that begins next week.
- **Memorize** 2 Corinthians 5:17: "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!"
