- M In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- M Sisters and brothers, in Jesus Christ we gather here on a solemn, reflective Wednesday to be reminded once again that we are dust and to dust we shall return. This day also marks the beginning of our journey into the season of Lent as we join Christians around the world who will take these forty days to prepare themselves to observe rightly the horror of our Lord's death and to celebrate the joy of his resurrection. Each of us will observe the season of Lent in a different way; some will do special devotions, others will practice self-denial, yet others, penitential reflection. Today let us unite as one in spirit and in truth to receive from God his Word and Sacrament and to return to him our humble worship and praise.

FIRST LESSON

Exodus 24:12-18, Bible page 80 *The glory of the Lord is a consuming fire.*

PRAYER

M Let us pray.

Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and penitence, that we may remember that it is only by your gracious gift that we are given everlasting life, through Jesus Christ, our Savior.

- C Amen.
- M People of God, you are invited in the spirit of penitence, to receive on your head or hand in ashes the sign of the cross, the symbol of our mortality, a symbol of the cost of sin, and yet the sign of our salvation and promise of eternal life.

THE IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Using ashes as a sign of repentance is an ancient practice, often mentioned in the Bible (e.g., Jonah 3:5-9; Job 42:6; Jeremiah 6:26; Matthew 11:21). The early Christians adopted the use of ashes from Jewish practice as an external mark of penitence. Ashes symbolize several aspects of our human existence: Ashes remind us of God's condemnation of sin, as God said to Adam, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). Ashes remind us of the shortness of human life, for it is said as we are buried: "earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust." Ashes are a symbol of our need to repent, confess our sins, and return to God.

While the psalm and anthem are being sung, those who desire to receive the sign of ashes may proceed to the stations near the front of the church. Please use the main aisle and return to your pew via the side aisles, and indicate whether you would prefer the sign on your head or on your hand.

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

CONFESSION/ABSOLUTION

- M Holy and righteous God, as we begin again the solemn spiritual journey of Lent, we come before you in deep humility. We confess that we are sinners, both by the nature we inherit and by the sinful thoughts and desires, words and actions that nature produces. Because of our sins, we deserve only your wrath and punishment. Yet you reveal yourself, not only as a God of holiness and justice but also as a God of mercy and love.
- C Lord, have mercy on us for your holy name's sake.
- M You have revealed your love and mercy for us in Jesus Christ, your Son, our Savior. You sent him into our world to be the atoning sacrifice for the sins of all people. Help us grasp by faith the great truth that the pain and suffering, the mockery and ridicule, and the death and punishment he endured should have been ours. Help us understand that in incomprehensible love he suffered and died for us.
- C Lord, have mercy on us for Jesus' sake.
- M In silent meditation let us reflect on our sins, praise our Savior for the forgiveness he has won for us, and ask for God's continued grace to remove any doubt that we are forgiven.

Time for silent meditation follows.

- M The Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, does not desire the death of sinners, but rather that they turn from their wickedness and live. Therefore, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.
- C During these days of Lent, we implore God to renew us through his Holy Spirit. May we remain in the true faith and at the last be received by him into the glories of heaven through the merits of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

LORD'S PRAYER

All Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.


