Luke 24:1-12, Bible page 1060 Pastor Peter Panitzke

EASTER CONFESSION OF FAITH

- M For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time.
- C Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive.
- M We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed--in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet.
- C For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality.
- M When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true:
- C "Death has been swallowed up in victory." "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.
