VIGIL OF EASTER / EASTER DAWN

A CELEBRATION OF OUR LORD'S RESURRECTION AND OUR BAPTISM

April 21, 2019

As WE GATHER The Christ Candle was removed from the sanctuary on Good Friday to dramatically depict Christ's human death and the temporary darkness which fell over the earth. To begin this Easter Vigil/Easter Dawn, the Christ Candle is brought back into the sanctuary with a blessing of the "new flame" and the return of the Light. The Paschal Candle is then lit, symbolizing Christ's resurrected presence from that first Easter until he returned to heaven on Ascension Day. This service is also a celebration of the re-birth and new life which is given to each of us through Holy Baptism.

BELLS CALLING US TO WORSHIP

INVOCATION

- M In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- M Dear friends in Christ, on this most holy night / morn, in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life, we are gathered here in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord. In hearing the Word and lifting our voices in thanksgiving and praise, we share in Christ's victory over death.
- C Christ Jesus, the same yesterday, today, and forever, the beginning and the end, the Alpha and Omega.
- M His are time and eternity; to him are the glory and dominion, now and forever. By his wounds we have healing both now and forever.
- C Amen.

LIGHTING OF THE PASCHAL CANDLE AND PROCESSION OF LIGHT

- M The Paschal candle represents our risen Lord shining in the light and the splendor of his resurrection. He is the new "pillar of fire" leading redeemed Israel out of the bondage of sin into the promised land.
- C May the light of Christ, who is risen in glory from the dead, scatter all the darkness of our hearts and minds.

M Let us pray.

Almighty and most merciful Father, once we were darkness, but now we are light in Jesus Christ, our Lord. Bless abundantly all who joyfully celebrate this night/day in faith in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Fill them with your heavenly blessing in him, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C Amen.

The Paschal candle is lit.

- M The light of Christ.
- C Thanks be to God.
- M Rejoice now, all you heavenly choirs of angels; rejoice now, all creation; sound forth, trumpet of salvation, and proclaim the triumph of our King. Know that the ancient darkness has been forever banished. Rejoice, O Church of Christ, clothed in the brightness of this light; let all this house of God ring out with rejoicing, with the praises of all God's faithful people.

PASCHAL HYMN

The day of resurrection! Earth, tell it out abroad, The Passover of gladness, The Passover of God. From death to life eternal, From this world to the sky, Our Christ has brought us over With hymns of victory.

Our hearts be pure from evil That we may see aright The Lord in rays eternal Of resurrection light, And list' ning to his accents, May hear, so calm and plain, His own "All hail!" and hearing, May raise the victor strain.

Now let the heav' ns be joyful, Let earth its song begin. Let all the world keep triumph and all that is therein. Let all things, seen and unseen, their notes of gladness blend; For Christ the Lord has risen, our joy that has no end!

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M Let us pray.

O God, you once delivered your people Israel from bondage under Pharaoh and led them in safety through the Red Sea, thereby giving us a picture of our baptism. Grant that we may ever be faithful to your baptismal promise, live in its grace, and show forth to all people your desire that all should be made the children of Abraham; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

C Amen.

Surely God is my salvation. I will trust in him and not be afraid.

- M This is the Word of the Lord.
- C Thanks be to God.

BAPTISMAL REMEMBRANCE

- On this holiest of days, the whole Church of our Lord Jesus Christ recalls his death and burial, rejoicing in the gospel of his glorious resurrection from the dead. Holy Baptism is the precious means of grace by which our Father in heaven connects us with Christ in his life, death, and resurrection. In Holy Baptism, God takes away our sins and gives new life in Christ, our Lord. We solemnly renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways; we confess the gift of faith in God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I ask you, therefore: Do you reject the devil along with all his lies and empty promises?
- C Yes, and I ask God to help me.
- M Do you believe in God, the Father almighty?
- C Yes, I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.
- M Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son?
- Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.
- M Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?
- C Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
- M Do you intend to continue in this faith, to be diligent in the use of Word and Sacrament, and in faith and action remain true to God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—as long as you live?
- C Yes, and I ask God to help me.

M Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, strengthen you with his grace to life everlasting.

C Amen.






ATTEND AN OPEN FORUM

- 1. Share a highlight from your celebration of Jesus' resurrection this year.
- 2. "Go, see for yourself!" As you feel comfortable, share the time in your life when you thought, "I have to prove it to myself that Jesus really did rise from the dead." Was it as a child? A teen? A young adult? A time of challenge in your life?
- 3. The angel said to the women, "Remember how he told you" (Luke 24:6). What do the following passages have in common?
 - Mark 9:9-10
 - Mark 9:30-32
 - Mark 10:32-34
- 4. Read I Corinthians 15:1-8. List the eyewitnesses to Jesus' resurrection. What other eyewitnesses can you add to that list from the rest of the Bible?
- 5. Read I Corinthians 15:12-23. What are some of God's promises to you that are made certain by lesus' resurrection?

6. Break up into groups of three or four for prayer: Share a fear or concern that you have for yourself or someone else. Then the person next to you is to pray for you to the Risen Savior to use the power he used to raise himself from the dead to help you.
