Christ, the Life of All the Living

- M In the name of the Father and of the † Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- M God is our refuge and strength, and ever-present help in trouble.
- C Therefore, we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea (*Psalm 46, vv. 1, 2*).
- M Be still, and know that I am God;
- C I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth.
- M The LORD Almighty is with us;
- C the God of Jacob is our fortress (Psalm 46, vv. 10, 11).

For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior, Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M This is a statement we can trust and is worthy of whole-hearted acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom each one of us must confess, I am the worst. But for this reason, God was merciful to us in order that Jesus Christ might demonstrate in us, the worst of sinners, all his patience as an example to those who are going to believe in him and live forever. Jesus died for you and rose again. Your sins are forgiven.
- C Amen.

On which the Prince of glory died,

Forbid it, Lord, that I should boast Save in the death of Christ, my God. All the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to his blood.

- M Let us pray.

Speak to our hearts.
