Upon the Cross Extended

- M In the name of the Father and of the † Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- M I lift up my eyes to the hills—where does my help come from?
- C My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth (Psalm 121:1, 2).
- M The LORD watches over you—the LORD is your shade at your right hand;
- C the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night.
- M The LORD will keep you from all harm—he will watch over your life;
- C the LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore (Psalm 121:5-8).

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

- M As we prepare to celebrate the mystery of Christ's love, let us confess our sin and ask the Lord for pardon and strength.
- C Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior, Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M This is a statement we can trust and is worthy of whole-hearted acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom each one of us must confess, I am the worst. But for this reason, God was merciful to us in order that Jesus Christ might demonstrate in us, the worst of sinners, all his patience as an example to those who are going to believe in him and live forever. Jesus died for you and rose again. Your sins are forgiven.
- C Amen.

O God, forsake me not! Lord, hear my supplication! In ev'ry evil hour Help me o'ercome temptation; And when the prince of hell My conscience seeks to blot, Be then not far from me -- O God, forsake me not!

O God, forsake me not! Lord, I am yours forever. Oh, keep me strong in faith That I may leave you never. Grant me a blessed end When my good fight is fought; Help me in life and death -- O God, forsake me not!
