Fruit of the Spirit: Patience

Galatians 5:22; Genesis 29:1-30

THE LESSON

Abraham, his son Isaac, and Isaac's son, Jacob, are known as the Patriarchs or forefathers of the Children of Israel. Last week we learned about Isaac making peace over water and wells. This week, we learn about Jacob and the great patience God gives him.

Jacob falls in love with a girl named Rachel, but in order to marry her, he makes a deal with Rachel's father, Laban. Laban says Jacob can marry Rachel if he works for Laban for seven years. Jacob agrees.

After the seven years are up, however, Laban tricks Jacob into marrying Rachel's older sister, Leah, first. Jacob is upset but loves Rachel and still wants to marry her.* Laban says he will allow it only if Jacob works for <u>another</u> seven years. Jacob agrees and trusts that God will give him the patience he needs. Patience is a fruit of the Spirit. Read about it in Genesis 29:1-30. Use the link above.

<u>THE POINT</u> Patience is a fruit of the Spirit.

* You may be wondering why Jacob has more than one wife at a time. This was not God's plan, but because people are sinful—even God's people—and because they are influenced by sinful cultures of people around them, they do not always follow God's Word. This was the case with Jacob and his father and grandfather. They all had multiple wives. This practice brought real trouble into their families, however.
