THE LESSON

David and Jonathan are best friends, but Jonathan's father, King Saul, hates David and wants him dead. David has won great victories for the Israelites over the giant Goliath and other enemies. David has also been told by God that he is to become the next king of Israel and replace Saul. Saul is jealous, angry, and afraid David will take over the kingdom. Saul tries several times to kill David.

Jonathan, who normally would become the next king – seeing as he is the current king's son – is a faithful and loving friend to David. Jonathan knows God wants David to be the next king. One time, Jonathan risks his own life to find out whether David is in danger, then sends David safely away from Saul.
