December has been a very busy month for our Community Outreach efforts here at St. Paul's. The generosity of our brothers and sisters overwhelms me and I feel compelled to share a summary of all the things we have done. Here are some statistics you might like to read.



- 86 children's Christmas gifts given to the clients of the Muskego Food Pantry
- 65 Christmas gifts given to the residents at Muskego Health Care Center
- 4 people volunteered their time shopping and wrapping for others
- 6 families were given Christmas Gifts and a Complete Christmas Dinner
- 5 donors are paying for rent totaling \$2,900 for a homeless Muskego family whose need was brought to us by the Muskego Food Pantry
- \$900+ paid towards a family's past due medical bills
- \$1,000 given towards a much needed operation for a friend of St. Paul's

Our facilities were used at no charge for 3 organizations:

- Muskego Food Pantry's Christmas Party
- Muskego Woman's Club Blood Drive
- Lifeline Health Screening in our area

I estimate that over \$11,000 went out to needy people last month. This is all to show Jesus' love towards people in our community.
