Josiah becomes king of Judah at age eight. Some years later, as an adult, Josiah commissions repairs on the Temple. Amid the renovations and repairs an amazing discovery is made. The workers find the Book of the Law, God's Word, the Scriptures. The find is taken to the king. Josiah reads the Scriptures and realizes he and the Israelites haven't been following God. How sad that God's Word had to be "discovered" in the very building it should have been being preached and taught! Josiah is sad and sorry. He reads these Scriptures to all the people. He wants everyone to change their ways. God's Word does change the hearts of the people of Judah. God's Word can change us, too.

- **Saturday:** "Make the most of every opportunity in these evil days" (Ephesians 5:16).
- **Sunday:** "Never stop praying" (1 Thessalonians 5:17).

At the end of the day, read the verse again and talk about how God changed the way you faced your day.
