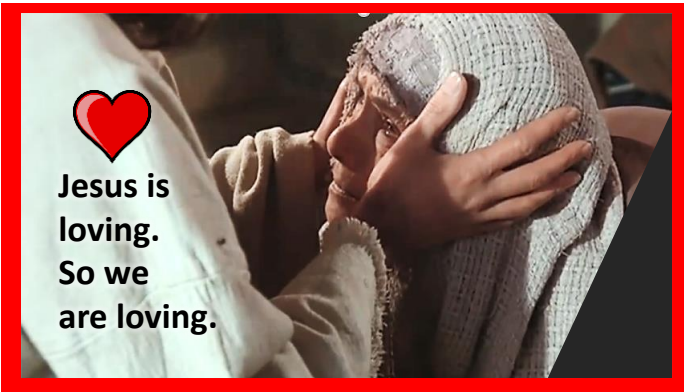


Jesus Heals a Crippled Woman on the Sabbath

THE LESSON...

One Sabbath day, Jesus sees a crippled woman in a synagogue. She's been unable to stand up straight for 18 years! Jesus heals her, even though the legalistic religious leaders don't approve. But Jesus values God's love over man-made rules. Read Luke 13:10-17 and watch the video on the resource page.
