Why/why not? Why does the Holy Spirit also give disciples today his power?



Students in grade 3-6 used dominoes to create a chain reaction. This activity helped students to visualize how the Holy Spirit can work through us as we share Jesus with someone and then this person shares it with someone else, and so on.
